"The Opening Ceremony is a tribute to Brazil and its treasures: nature, people football," she told FIFA.

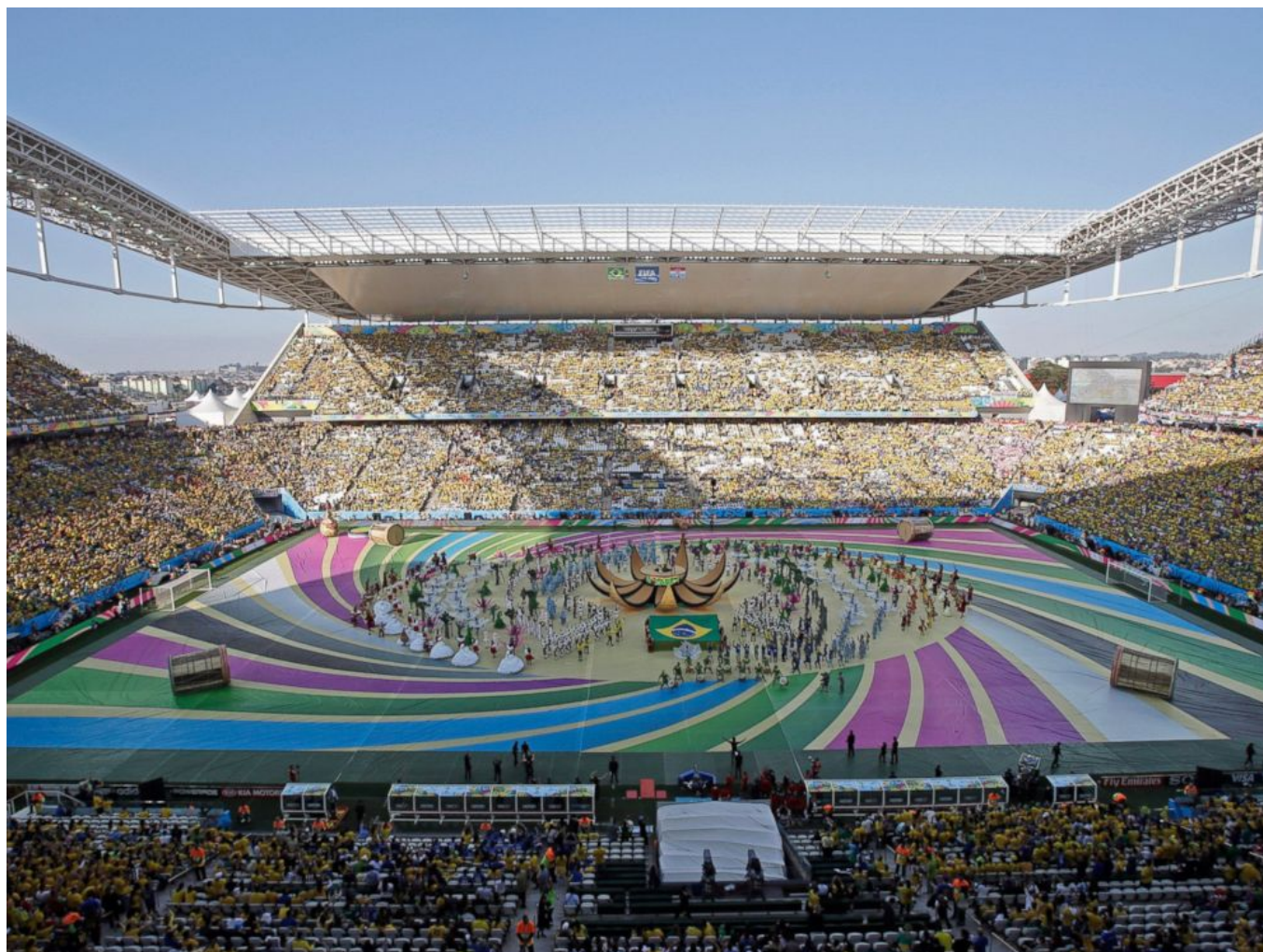
Brazil is home to the Amazon Rainforest. So there you have it.
